

Quail Forest Welcomes a Newborn Boy

The new dad is also a sculptor, welder, artist and “all around tinkerer,” according to Farren. Their house is full of Mike’s art, including the moss sculpture shown in the photo and colorful paintings of animals in Henry’s nursery.
